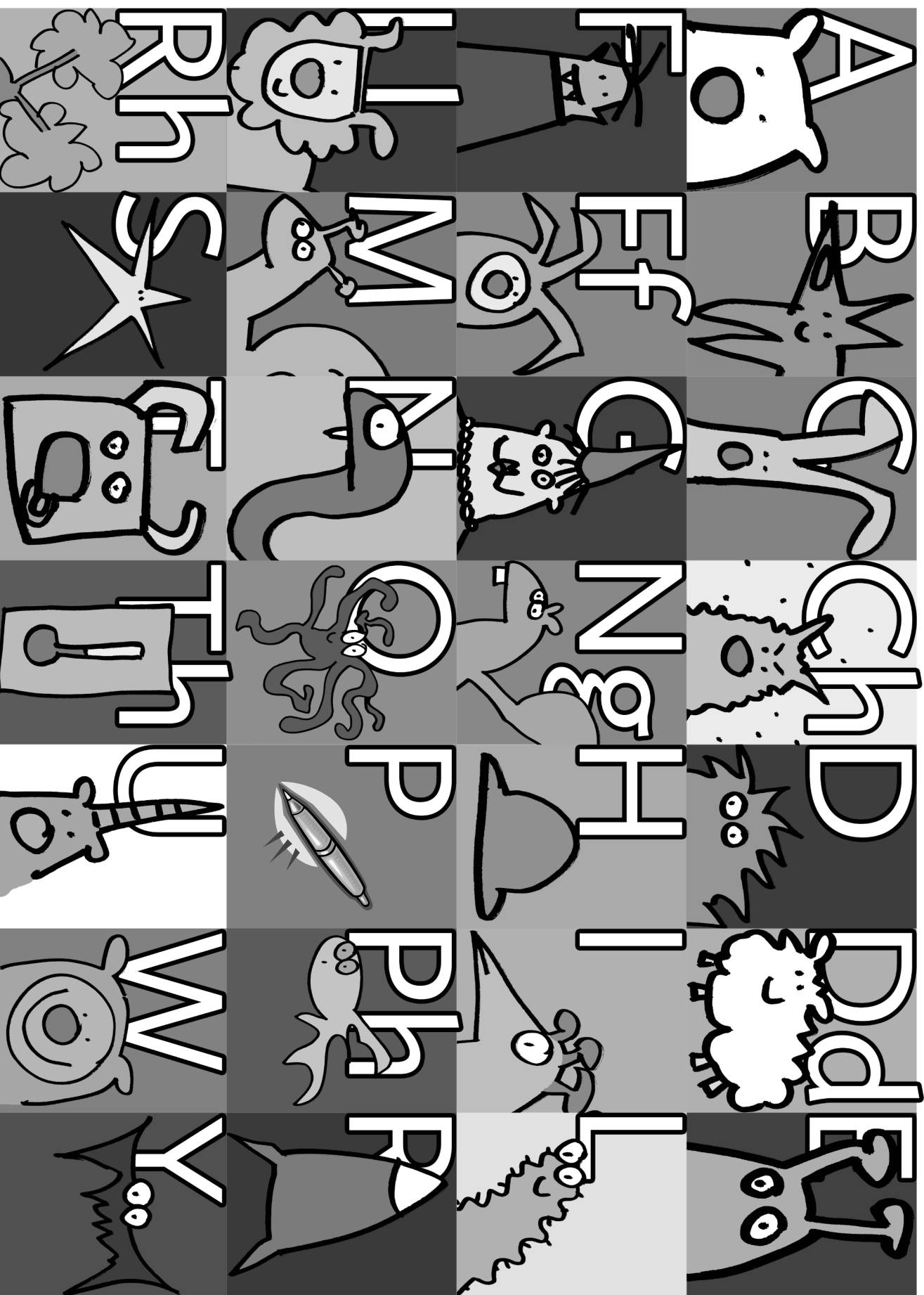

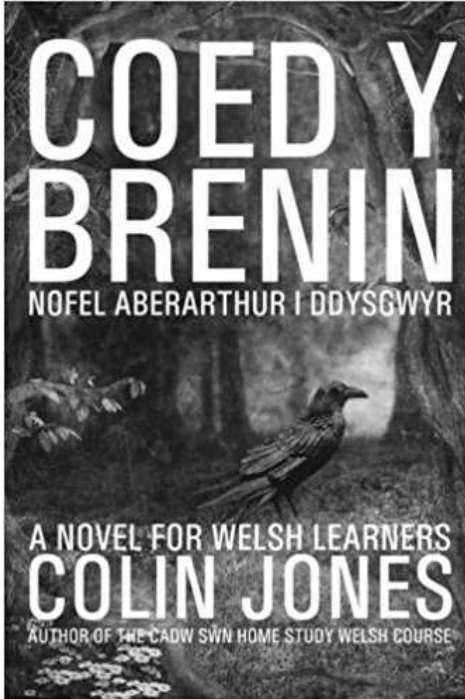

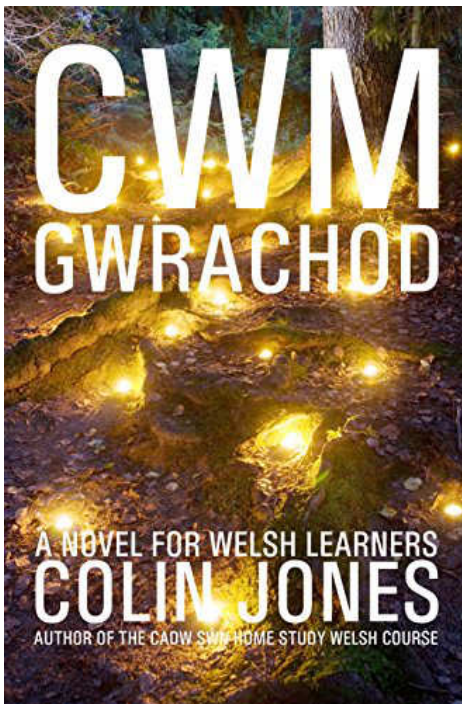
Simple Welsh in an Hour of Your Time

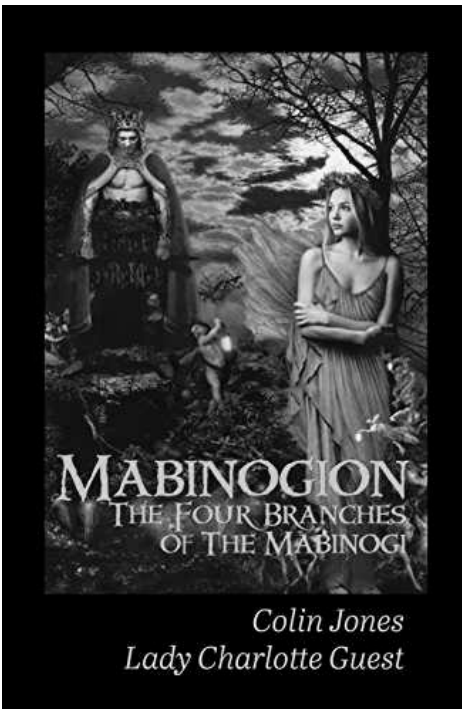
A novel for Welsh learners
